The City of Crystal Lake would like to invite you and your neighbors to a follow-up Open House meeting at Crystal Lake City Hall to continue discussing flooding in your neighborhood. Questions will be answered from the September 2017 open house and the conceptual project(s) to improve intermittent flooding in your neighborhood will be presented. The goal of the meeting is to obtain your concurrence and additional feedback about the conceptual project(s) prior to proceeding with a request for funding for future engineering and construction.

The **Open House for your neighborhood will be held on Thursday February 1, 2018 at 7:30 pm** at City Hall, 100 W. Woodstock Street, Crystal Lake. Your participation in this workshop will ensure that your perspective and feedback are understood.

Residents affected by flooding in your neighborhood have received this same letter inviting them to attend the Open House. Additional open houses are scheduled for other neighborhood flooding areas so that adequate time and attention can be provided for each of these unique areas.
