## 2 the Core Bodyworks – Special Use Permit Project Review for Planning and Zoning Commission

Meeting Date: February 19, 2020

**Request:** Special Use Permit to allow a massage establishment.

**Location:** 78 N. Williams Street

**Existing Zoning:** B-4 Mixed Use Business

**Surrounding Properties:** North: B-4 Mixed Use Business

South: B-4 Mixed Use Business East: B-4 Mixed Use Business West: B-4 Mixed Use Business

#### **Background:**

- Existing Use: The business was located at 81 N. Williams Street for years and prior to the requirement to obtain a Special Use Permit for a massage establishment. Since the business relocated, it is now required to obtain the SUP.
- There have been no issues with this business.
- <u>UDO Requirements</u>: Massage Establishments are required to obtain a special use permit. The special use permit requires all massage establishments to comply with certain criteria.
- The petitioner has also made an application for a Massage Establishment License, which is processed by the Community Development Department.

#### **Development Analysis:**

#### General

- Request: The petitioner is requesting a special use permit for a Massage Establishment.
- <u>Land Use</u>: The land use map shows the area as Commerce. This land use designation is appropriate for this use.
- Zoning: The site is zoned B-4, which allows a massage establishment as a Special Use.

#### **Comprehensive Land Use Plan 2030 Summary Review:**

The Comprehensive Plan designates the subject property as Commerce, which allows for existing and future retail and service uses. The following goal is applicable to this request:

#### Land Use - Commerce

Goal: Maintain a dynamic and sustainable base of commercial uses that provides a solid tax base, goods, services and jobs to the city, as well as, the surrounding region through coordination in the Unified Development Ordinance, Comprehensive Land Use Plan and Economic Development Strategic Plan.

Supporting Action: Promote, retain and attract businesses that provide a diverse tax base.

Success Indicator: The number of new small independent business occupancies.

#### **Findings of Fact:**

The petitioner has requested a Special Use Permit to allow a massage establishment at the subject property. Special Uses require a separate review because of their potential to impact surrounding properties and the orderly development of the City. Section 2-400 B of the Unified Development Ordinance establishes standard for all Special Uses in Crystal Lake. The criteria are as follows:

- 3. The petitioner shall address all of the review comments and requirements of the Community Development, Fire Rescue and Police Departments.

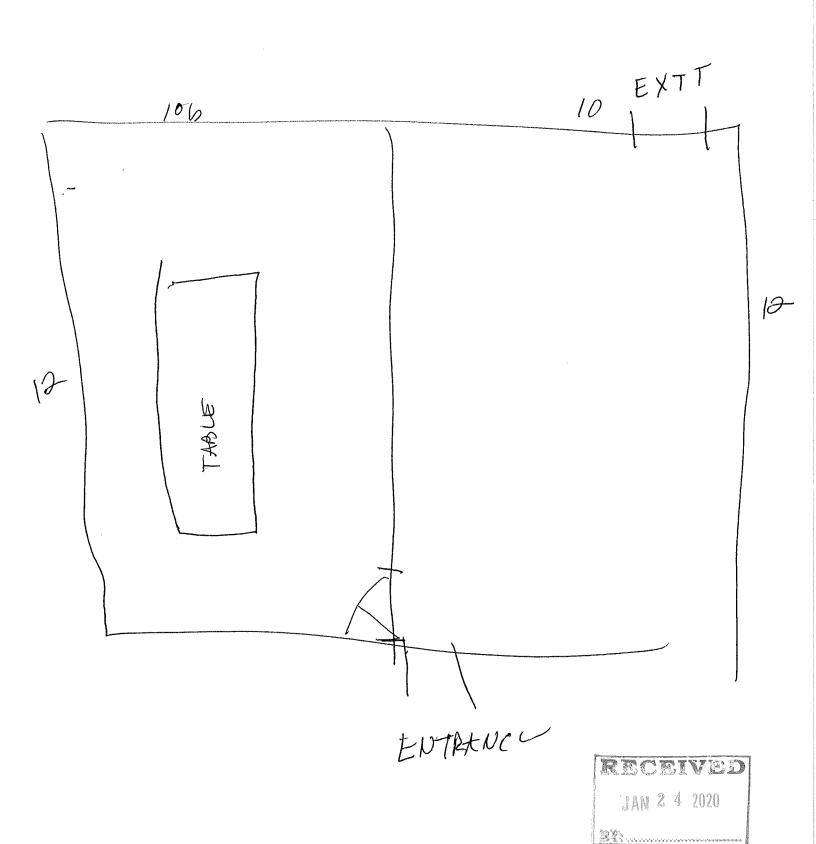
