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IMPORTANT

Upcoming Payroll Changes



This is a friendly reminder regarding the upcoming payroll transition to move from a paid-to-date payroll to a one-week pay lag beginning with the first paycheck in October. This transition will take place over five pay periods by shifting each pay cycle by one business day for 5 pay periods.

You will still receive your full 2-weeks of pay on each paycheck throughout this transition, however the pay date will be extended by one business day each pay period for five pay periods. There are no changes to your paid hours, only the date paid.

For example, during the first transition pay period, rather than being paid on Friday, October 4, you will be paid the following Monday, October 7. The next pay date will be 15 days later on a Tuesday (10/22), the next pay date 15 days later on a Wednesday (11/6) and so on until we reach Friday, December 6 for the full one-week lag in pay.

This change will have no effect on accruals or benefits and you will still receive two paychecks each month during the transition.

Pay Dates for the remainder of 2024:

- Monday, October 7
- Tuesday, October 22
- Wednesday, November 6
- Thursday, November 21
- Friday, December 6
- Friday, December 20
