What is a Garage Burglary?

Garage Burglaries are crimes of opportunity which occur in almost every community throughout the United States. Garage burglars typically enter through an open garage door, or through a side



your garage and leave without you even knowing they were there, until it is too late. Historically speaking, the amount of Garage Burglaries drastically increases with the onset of warm weather. Many people leave their garage door open while working in the yard, leave it open for a pet, or simply forget to shut the door before retiring for the evening. Whatever reason you may have for leaving the garage door open, the Crystal Lake Police Department encourages you to reconsider, and to follow the preventative techniques outlined in this brochure. Don't be the victim of a crime of opportunity, close the door on Garage Burglaries!

Prevention Techniques

A man is walking down the street late one night and observes an open garage door and no lights on in the house. As he walks up to the door, he observes a brand new set of golf clubs leaning up against the wall, and within seconds he hoists them over his shoulder and continues down the street. You were just the victim of a crime of opportunity that could have potentially been avoided if you followed a few key prevention methods:

- Close your garage door, even if you are simply doing yard work in the backyard.
- Watch to make sure your garage closes completely.
- Never leave valuables in your vehicle, even if it is parked in the driveway.
- Always keep the door that leads from your garage into your home locked.
- Put the items with the highest value furthest into the garage.
- If you have a side door which leads into your garage, always keep that door locked. If that door has glass panels, you might want to install a double cylinder dead bolt. This lock requires a key to unlock the door from both the outside and inside. This ensures that if a burglar breaks the glass, they cannot reach in and turn the lock to gain entry.
- Install an "open garage door" indicator, which is available at your local hardware store. A red light will illuminate on the display if the garage door is left open, reminding you to shut it.

Watch out for Your Neighbors

Neighborhood Watch groups are established all over the City of Crystal Lake. If you are not a part of your local Neighborhood Watch group, the Crystal Lake Police Department encourages you to inquire about joining. Regardless of membership, every citizen should keep an eye out for their neighbors and their property. If your neighbor has left their garage door open,
