


Chapter two Community Profile

2.1 Demographic Information


City Population

The City of Crystal Lake has a total population of 40,743 based on the 2010 Census. This population is expected to continue to slowly rise as more people discover this beautiful area and relocate here. The City still has available land which can be developed as residential land uses. In addition, many older areas are prime for redevelopment and infill development. The following chart illustrate the current distribution of the City population.




Household Information

The City has a total of 14,894* housing units, the majority of which are owner occupied single family houses. The rental units are a combination of single-family, duplex, apartment and condominium units. The chart below shows there are about two-thirds the number of single-family owner occupied housing as rental housing.



Crystal Lake's median household income is \$74,663 \(\triangle \). This is above the median income for McHenry County and for the State of Illinois. Crystal Lake's higher median income level is key to attracting retail tenants. The income level also points to the value of homes in the area.

2.2 City Limits / Boundary Line Agreements

Crystal Lake has established boundary line agreements with the neighboring communities including Woodstock, Lakewood and Lake in the Hills. Our current City limits abut Cary on the southeast and Prairie Grove to the northeast. Bull Valley is a few miles north of the City.



2.3 Quality of Life

The City of Crystal Lake is committed to continuing the high quality of life enjoyed by the citizens and businesses of the Crystal Lake community.

Crystal Lake is located 50 miles northwest of Chicago, a short drive from O'Hare International Airport and near several major highways and interstates. The Union Pacific rail line provides easy access to Chicago. As a result, Crystal Lake residents enjoy the many employment, cultural and recreational opportunities of a major metro city, yet live in a pleasant, friendly, small-town atmosphere.

Beginning in the 1970's, Crystal Lake experienced significant changes in both its residential and business population. The population has grown from 14,000 in the early 1970's to over 40,000 today.

The local job market continues to expand. With this expansion, citizens have access to excellent educational, recreational and cultural activities. Crystal Lake boasts two of the very best public school systems in the region - Elementary School District 47 and Community High School District 155. Citizens are also served by the parochial grade schools and the ever-expanding McHenry County College is on Crystal Lake's northern border.

Crystal Lake is truly a great place to live and work and it's also a great place to play! One of Crystal Lake's greatest attractions is its public parks system. This includes over 1,400 acres of parks and open space as well as 230-acre Crystal Lake for fishing, boating, swimming, skating in the winter...it's truly year-round fun! The City also owns and operates Three Oaks Recreation Area, a 500-acre spring fed lake, with a marina, lake house, picnic grove, sled hill and natural area and trails.

The City staff and elected officials are dedicated to continuing to make Crystal Lake one of the premier communities in northern Illinois.


